What is the DRO (Disaster Resilient Organization)?

The BayPrep Program brings together local government, corporate, nonprofit and philanthropic leaders in the San Francisco Bay Area in a joint effort to identify gaps in disaster preparedness and develop ways to improve preparedness and response capacity in the region.

With our partners – San Francisco CARD (Community Agencies Responding to Disaster), the American Red Cross of the Bay Area, United Way of the Bay Area, and the City of San Francisco Department of Emergency Management – the DRO program involves intensive one-on-one consulting, technical assistance, training, and interactive problem solving to enhance your organization's ability to be there for your clients following a major disaster.

The DRO offers quarterly meetings with a larger multi-sector community of preparedness and other opportunities to help integrate your organization into networks and partnerships that will allow your organization to perform its role in disaster response, recovery, and rebuilding afterwards.

What does the DRO Project Involve? What is the Commitment and What are its Benefits?

- Your agency will designate a primary contact for the DRO.
- You will attend quarterly Community of Preparedness meetings to network and share best practices.
- We will work toward achieving the following key steps:
 - Disaster Mission Statement
 - Continuity of Operations Plan
 - Personal Preparedness Training for Key Staff
 - Identifying Gaps and Outlining Solution
 - Joining a Network of Preparedness in San Francisco
- We will support your organization with technical assistance facilitated by a CBO Liaison to assist efforts and increase confidence within the organizations.
- The Standard for CBO Resilience will serve as common benchmarks of success for Disaster Resilient Organizations. Organizations achieving these Standards can signal their capacities, enhancing their ability to form partnerships and, possibly, their competitiveness for funds to address identified preparedness gaps.
