

HOW TO GIVE

At The San Francisco Foundation, philanthropy is dynamic and evolving – reflecting the changing needs of our communities and the vision of people who, in partnership with us, are building their own philanthropic traditions, generation after generation.

CREATE A FUND

We offer a broad spectrum of charitable giving vehicles – powerful philanthropic tools for individuals, families, or businesses. Our donors have the flexibility to open and add to their funds with donations of cash, securities, real estate, or life insurance. Contact us directly, or ask your banker, broker, or financial advisor to get in touch with The San Francisco Foundation.

CHOOSE YOUR PHILANTHROPIC VEHICLE

Donors can distribute their money while maintaining their options. They select the type of fund that meets their charitable objectives and choose how involved they want to be in making grants.

Donor Advised Funds

For individuals and families seeking active involvement in philanthropy, Donor Advised Funds create a working partnership with the Foundation. As a donor, you are able to chart the course of your giving according to your own principles and charitable interests by making specific recommendations for grants to nonprofit organizations. You may establish the fund in your own or your family's name; or you may select a different name – e.g., “The Golden Gate Fund” – to protect your confidentiality. Along with maximizing your tax benefits, you will be free from the details of financial management, reporting, and other paperwork – you focus only on the beneficial use of your donations. Donor Advised Funds harness powerful philanthropy in a simple manner.

Recommend a Grant

Once you have established a fund, you can send us your gift-giving recommendations in writing, via fax, or online through our website: www.sff.org. Grant recommendations from donors provide support to a wide range of nonprofit organizations. See page 49 for a list of this year's donor advised grant recipients.

Permanent Endowed Funds

Donors may choose to create funds that will express their individual or family's charitable interests in perpetuity. These funds direct annual support to one or more specifically named charitable organizations, or to an issue that the donor selects (such as at-risk children, the environment, or women's health). Endowed funds can be named by the donor to reflect a family name or charitable interest, or to honor a family member, friend, or colleague; they can also be given another name that protects the donor's anonymity. Endowed funds can be created during a donor's lifetime, or by testamentary gift.

Planned Gifts

Vehicles such as Charitable Remainder Trusts, from which the donor or the donor's designee will receive income for life, allow assets to be committed now and received by the Foundation at a specified future date or upon the donor's death. Bequests also provide a vehicle to establish a philanthropic legacy. These deferred gifts can create an endowed fund at The San Francisco Foundation from which annual support can be directed to one or more charitable organizations, or to an issue of particular importance to the donor, in perpetuity.

Impact Funds

The San Francisco Foundation creates targeted funds for focused grantmaking. These funds are designed to respond to the vibrant and quickly changing landscape of the Bay Area's nonprofit community. For more information on the currently active funds, please refer to our website: www.sff.org.

Stephanie DiMarco, chair, is founder and CEO of Advent Software, Inc., the company she co-founded in 1983. 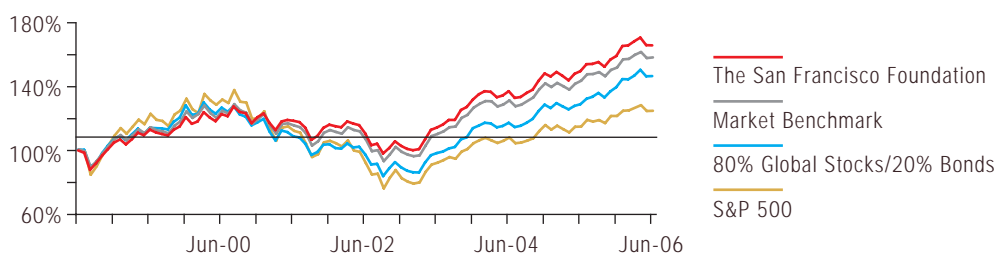

She chairs the investment committee at the Fine Arts Museum of San Francisco and serves as a trustee of the Golden Gate Conservancy.

INVESTMENT PERFORMANCE



Dear Donors,

We are pleased to bring you this year's investment report with the fourth consecutive year of positive returns. During the downturn of 2000-2002 our portfolio outperformed the market by over 2% per year. The portfolio has fully matched the 2003-2006 market's recovery with a 13.2% average annual return over the last three years.

As of June 30, 2006, the total investments supervised by the Investment Committee and the Trustees of The San Francisco Foundation were \$883 million. During the year, the investment portfolio earned nearly \$75 million dollars, and the long term investment portfolio achieved an investment return of 10.7% net of investment management fees. During the same period the S&P 500 returned 8.6%, and the average performance of our peer community foundations was 9.3%.

We seek to optimize long-term returns while minimizing risk and volatility. The portfolio is invested in a structured set of well diversified, higher-returning asset classes with high quality managers and index funds. As of June 30, 2006, the portfolio was invested in equities (large cap, mid cap, small cap, and international), fixed income, absolute return fund of funds, long/short credit, hedged equity, and private equity. Donor advisors also have the option of investing in socially responsible funds.

The San Francisco Foundation's Investment Committee is comprised of Trustees and investment professionals who are charged by the Board of Trustees with the responsibility of asset allocation, manager selection, and ongoing supervision of the Foundation's assets. The Committee meets regularly to review the performance of the Foundation's managers and make decisions regarding the appropriate asset allocation and professional management. I thank them for their time, energy, and professional expertise.

The committee is supported by staff and consultants who contribute to the daily management of the portfolio. I would like to acknowledge Monica Pressley, the Foundation's CFO, and her finance staff, as well as Colonial Consulting's Mike Miller.

Underlying all of our investment activities is our commitment to the Foundation's mission in support of our community and in the realization of your charitable goals. We build our investment strategy to enable us to deepen our impact in community.

Financial Statements

REPORT OF MANAGEMENT

The San Francisco Foundation management is responsible for the preparation of the previous condensed financial statements. The condensed financial statements have been excerpted from the Foundation's audited financial statements as of and for the years ended June 30, 2006, and 2005. The financial statements were audited by Hood & Strong LLP. Hood & Strong reported that the statements are fairly presented, in all material respects, in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Their reports and copies of the complete audited financial statements are available upon request.

The Board of Trustees of The San Francisco Foundation consists entirely of independent appointees. In 2005, in conformance with the Nonprofit Integrity Act, the Foundation established a separate Audit Committee. This Audit Committee, a subcommittee of the Board, is responsible for appointment, compensation, and oversight of the audit work performed by Hood & Strong. In prior years, the Budget and Audit Committee oversaw the audit function.

The Foundation did not engage Hood & Strong to perform any management advisory services during the years presented. The Chief Executive Officer and the Chief Financial Officer confirm that the information contained in the condensed financial statements fairly presents, in all material respects, the financial position and results of activities of the Foundation for the years ended June 30, 2006, and 2005. Management maintains a framework of internal controls designed to help ensure the accuracy and integrity of the Foundation's financial data, compliance with donor restrictions and instructions, and proper safeguarding of assets. This framework includes policies, procedures, and organizational structures, all of which are overseen by the Board.

The internal control structure of the Foundation includes policies that reflect the Foundation's dedication to high standards of integrity and ethics. Written policy statements cover, among other subjects, the confidentiality of the Foundation's donors and the potential conflict of employees' and Board members' outside interests.

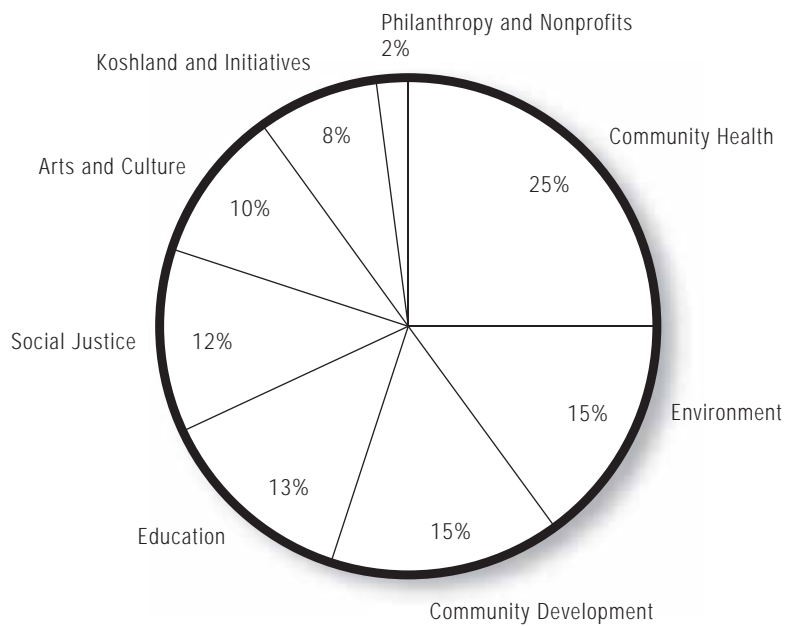

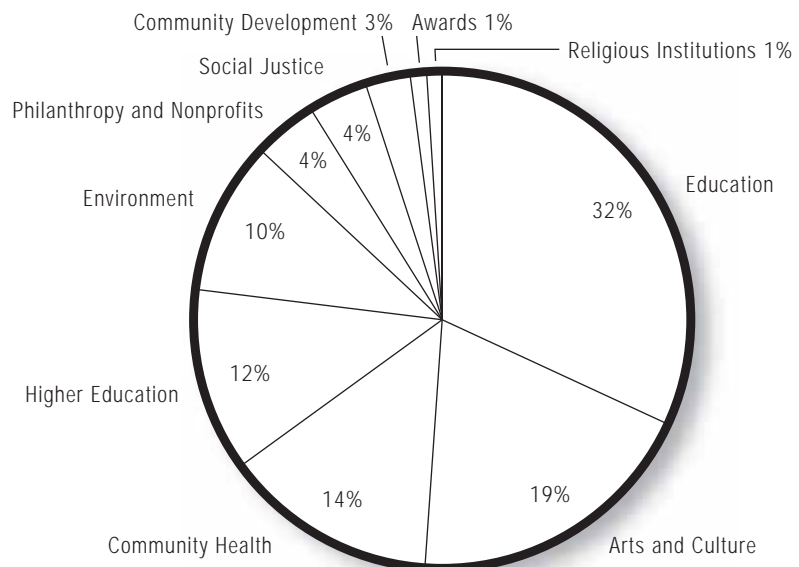
